UNIFORM STATEWIDE BOND SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, the Florida Supreme Court issued Administrative Order AOSC23-88 on December 12, 2023, creating a Uniform Statewide Bond Schedule effective January 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the bond schedule applies when police or county jail or pretrial release employees exercise their discretion to release a person on bond before that person's first appearance hearing; and

WHEREAS, Florida Supreme Court Order AOSC23-88 allows a chief judge of a judicial circuit to add conditions of release and/or increase the bond amounts above those required by the uniform statewide bond schedule contained in said order; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Statewide Bond Schedule shall not bind a judge in an individual case who is conducting a first appearance hearing or bail determination;

NOW THEREFORE, it is ORDERED:

The following bond schedule is effective in the 16th Judicial Circuit from January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.

- 1. For persons arrested for a capital felony, life felony, felony of the first degree, felony of the second degree, felony of the third degree or who meet the criteria outlined in Florida Statute 903.011(6):
 - a. The person was, at the time of the arrest for any felony, on pretrial release, probation or community control in this state or any other state; or
 - b. The person was, at the time of the arrest, designated as a sexual offender or sexual predator in this state or any other state; or
 - c. The person was arrested for violating a protective injunction; or
 - d. The person was, at the time of the arrest, on release from supervision under s. 947.1405, s. 947.146, a 947.149, or s. 944.4731; or
 - e. The person has, at any time before

	the current arrest, been sentenced pursuant to s. 775.082(9) or s. 775.084 as a prison releasee reoffender, habitual violent felony offender, three-time violent felony offender or violent career criminal; or f. The person has been arrested three or more times in the 6 months immediately preceding his or her arrest for the current offense; or g. The person has failed to appear at required court proceedings while out on bail.	
2.	For persons not covered by number 1, arrested for a first degree misdemeanor or an ordinance punishable like a first degree misdemeanor, that involves any amount of force or threat of force against a person or a person arrested for stalking as defined in Florida Statute 784.048(2)	Bond: None. First Appearance Required.
3.	For any person arrested for driving under the influence or boating under the influence	Bond: None. First Appearance Required.
4.	For persons not covered by number 1, arrested for a first degree misdemeanor or an ordinance punishable like a first degree misdemeanor, that does not involve any force or threat against a person and that is not driving under the influence or boating under the influence.	Bond: \$2,500.00
5.	For persons not covered by number 1, arrested for a second degree misdemeanor or an ordinance punishable like a second degree misdemeanor, that involves any amount of force or threat of force against a person.	Bond: \$2,500.00
6.	For persons not covered by number 1, arrested for a second degree misdemeanor or an ordinance punishable like a second degree misdemeanor, that does not involve force or threat of force against a person and that is not driving under the influence or boating under the influence.	Bond: \$500.00

If a person arrested is eligible for bond under this schedule, but jail staff or pretrial release staff are unable to make a determination as to their status under Florida Statute 903.011(6), the defendant shall be required to attend a First Appearance hearing.

Administrative Order 2.063-10-1, *Uniform Bond Schedule*, is amended in its entirety and rescinded at 11:59 pm on December 31, 2023.
